School Review Update

A group of local head teachers were invited to visit us on Monday to review the quality of the wider curriculum offered at our school. The focus was science, history and geography, and we had a productive day, observing lessons, chatting to pupils and looking at their work.

The lessons observed were enjoyable and challenging, and included lots of hands-on learning which inspired and engaged the pupils. We were impressed with the children's efforts and enthusiasm, and the confident way in which they could articulate what they had learnt. They were also given a good level of support by the teachers and TAs.

Following this review and other monitoring activities carried out in school, we are working to ensure that there is a clear progression of skills and knowledge in all subjects across the curriculum, and that pupils have regular opportunities to apply what they have learnt in different contexts.
