School Routines

The safety of our children is of the highest priority for us. We have clear guidelines that we must follow to ensure this and limiting the access of adults to the school is key. Therefore we ask that parents support us and allow their children to enter school independently in the mornings. This is a particularly busy time, so this approach will also enable the children to settle to their learning more quickly. We understand that you may need to share important information with school staff. We actively encourage this, and ask that if you wish to speak to a member of staff, you use the main entrance on Halifax Road. Mrs Sutton and Mrs Low will be only too happy to help. They will be able to pass on a message, arrange an appointment with your child's class teacher or ask them to ring you at a convenient time. You can also usually find Mrs Brown on the school yard at 8:50 and 3:30 and she is always happy to chat with you about your child.

Parents will not be admitted through the pupil entrance, with the exception of organised events such as parents' evenings and open mornings.

Parents should bring pupils to the main entrance if they arrive at school after 9am. School staff will make sure they get to their classrooms.

We hope you understand that these measures are to ensure the safety of all our children and provide a positive start to the school day.
