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General School Information

Contact Tracing during the Christmas Break

We have been asked by the Department for Education and Public Health England to provide a track and trace service for the first 6 days of the Christmas holidays.

This means that **you will need to inform the school:**

- If your child has **Covid symptoms**, then **tests positive for Covid and was in school in the 48 hour period before the onset of symptoms.**
- If your child is asymptomatic and **tests positive and they have been in school within the 48 hour period before the test was taken.**

In the above cases, please email the school as soon as possible via office@thurgolandprimary.org providing:

- Your child's name and class
- Date the symptoms started
- Date of the positive test
- Date of the positive result

Following a positive test, we will get in touch with anyone your child has been in contact with. Identified contacts will be informed that they will need to self-isolate for 10 days.

If your child is a contact, we will get in touch with you via text and email. Please check your emails regularly during the first week of the holiday.

School staff will be administering track and trace up to and including Christmas Eve.

We sincerely hope that you all stay healthy and safe and will not need to use this service!

Contact Tracing continued...

School will NOT need to be informed:

- Where a pupil tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed **symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school**
- Where a parent tests positive but the child does not develop symptoms

In these cases, parents should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

If pupils are ill or self-isolating and will not be able to return to school at the beginning of the new term, please inform us in the usual way, by email or phone call, by 8:30 on Monday 4th January.
