As educators we are all passionate about the way children are formed by the environment in which they grow. To become our best self we will need the environment that enables this.



What are we learning about this half term?

This half term, Class 2 will embark on an exciting journey of discovery across various subjects. Our goal is to provide a well-rounded educational experience that fosters children to love to learn, give things a go, be resilient, show respect and aim high. Below is an overview of the topics we will explore.

Reading:

In Reading, we will read the following books: After the Fall, Burglar Bill and Five Minutes Peace.

Our focus will be on developing oral comprehension skills and key vocabulary.

Writing:

In writing we will be exploring narrative writing with a focus on Paddington and information texts with a focus on London.

Our focus will be on developing the use of adjectives to describe characters and settings. Children will also use statement sentences to write a non-chronological report.

Mathematics:

Our mathematics curriculum will cover foundational concepts, including: Place value and Addition and Subtraction. We will be practising our 2, 5 and 10 times tables.

Science.

In science, we will focus on: Materials and their properties. Students will learn about how the properties of materials can affect how they are used.

Physical Education:

Ball skills and Imoves dance.

PHSE/RSE:

Keeping safe to prevent accidents and making healthy food choices.

DT:

Winding mechanisms. Children will design and make a moving toy.

Music

Call and response animals. Children use instruments to represent animals and to create call and response rhythms.

Geography:

Our learning is all about human and physical features in the UK and specifically in London.

This half term promises to be an enriching and enjoyable experience for all students in Class 2. We look forward to a season filled with learning, growth, and fun!
