As educators we are all passionate about the way children are formed by the environment in which they grow. To become our best self we will need the environment that enables this.



What are we learning about this half term?

This half term, Class 5 will embark on an exciting journey of discovery across various subjects. Our goal is to provide a well-rounded educational experience that fosters children to love to learn, give things a go, be resilient, show respect and aim high. Below is an overview of the topics we will explore.

Reading:

In Reading, we will read the following book: The Explorer by C. Rundell

Our focus will be on developing our understanding of new vocabulary and different question types for written answers.

Writing:

In writing we will be exploring poetry with examples of figurative language and animal themed non chronological reports. Children will have the opportunity to write short descriptive narratives from first person and well as a set of instructions about how to survive if you crash land in the jungle.

Our focus will be on developing higher level sentence structures.

Mathematics:

Our mathematics curriculum will cover foundational concepts, including:

Knowledge of number, place value, addition and subtraction and multiplication and division.

Science:

In science, we will focus on: Space. Students will learn about different planets in our solar system, night and day and shadows.

Physical Education:

In PE children will be learning football skills and participating in some Aztec dancing.

PHSE/RSE:

This half term, children will be looking at the topic of keeping and staying safe. They will look at how we can be influenced and pressured to make unsafe choices and ways in which we can stay safe.

Art / DT:

In DT, children will be building carousels powered by circuits built in ICT. In Art, class 5 will be creating portraits inspired by Frieda Kahlo.

Music:

Children will learn and perform songs about Ancient Egypt (a link to their Y3 topic) and play a simple melody.

Geography / History:

This half term, Y5 will be learning about the Ancient Maya; they will learn about the Spanish invasion and how this affected the lives of the Maya.

French:

Children will learn body parts using fun monster mash ups.

This half term promises to be an enriching and enjoyable experience for all students in Class 5. We look forward to a season filled with learning, growth, and fun!
