As educators we are all passionate about the way children are formed by the environment in which they grow. To become our best self we will need the environment that enables this.



What are we learning about this half term?

This half term, Class 1 will embark on an exciting journey of discovery across various subjects. Our goal is to provide a well-rounded educational experience that fosters children to love to learn, give things a go, be resilient, show respect and aim high. Below is an overview of the topics we will explore.

Reading:

In Reading, we will read the following books: Anna Hibiscus, Cops and Robbers and The Bear and the Piano.

Our focus will be on understanding the sequence of the story and thinking about how the characters might feel. We will develop our oracy skills to ask questions about a text for a deeper understanding of the events that occur.

Writing:

In writing we will be exploring the same books as we do in reading which allows us to develop our understanding of the story. Our in-depth understanding of the stories supports oracy and develops our ability to write about the narrative we are reading. Our focus this half term will continue and we will develop our use of capital letter, finger spaces and full stops. We will work hard to develop the use of 'and' and 'because' so we can extend our writing skills. We will develop our independent writings skills and start to apply more of what we know.

Mathematics:

Our mathematics curriculum will cover a range of concepts, including: understanding of place value, addition and subtraction as well as geometry. We further develop our mathematical skills through our 'Mastering Number' programme to develop our mental maths skills and support our mathematical understanding.

Science:

In science, we will focus on: Pets

In this unit the children will explore, identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. They will also describe and compare the structure of a variety of common animals including pets.

Physical Education:

In PE we cover a range of skills this half term, including our gymnastic units. We will also develop our ball skills withing the unit 'Target games'.

PSHE:

In PSHE, we will focus on: Relationships

In this unit the children will explore friendships and how we behave within our friendships.

DT:

In DT we learn how to sew! We design a snowman finger puppet and sew this carefully. We then add additional features to the finger puppet to make it come alive!

Our focus this half term is Christianity where we learn new vocabulary and information about the Christian faith. We investigate the question... What do Christians believe God is like?

Music:

In music, we will focus on: Tempo

This half term the children will be exploring more about the tempo using their voices, bodies and instruments to show how fast or slow a song is.

History:

In our History unit we focus on how Thurgoland used to be. We look at the old buildings in the village and how these have changed. We think about what the village used to look like and how we can spot an older building.

This half term promises to be an enriching and enjoyable experience for all students in Class 1. We look forward to a season filled with learning, growth, and fun!
