As educators we are all passionate about the way children are formed by the environment in which they grow. To become our best self we will need the environment that enables this.



What are we learning about this half term?

This half term, Class 3 will embark on an exciting journey of discovery across various subjects. Our goal is to provide a well-rounded educational experience that fosters children to love to learn, give things a go, be resilient, show respect and aim high. Below is an overview of the topics we will explore.

Reading:

We will read George's Marvellous Medicine as a class, exploring the story, characters and vocabulary. We will discuss the plot and practise answering questions to improve our understanding and thinking skills.

Writing:

We will learn to write a biography about Mary Anning by sorting information in chronological order and using time words to link ideas. Our writing will be inspired by Stone Girl, Bone Girl. We will also write narratives based on George's Marvellous Medicine that include direct speech, focusing on punctuating it correctly and showing characters' personalities.

Mathematics:

We will be continuing our learning about addition and subtraction, using different methods to solve problems. We will then move on to our next topics, including multiplication and division, using objects, pictures and number facts to help us understand.

Science:

In science, we will focus on Rocks and Fossils. We will learn about different types of rocks and how they are formed. We will explore how to compare their properties and how soil is made. We will also find out how fossils are formed and what they tell us about plants and animals from the past. We will learn how rocks and fossils help us understand Earth's history.



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Physical Education:

We will be taking part in swimming lessons each Thursday. On Fridays, we will be developing our dance skills with a series of lessons inspired by Stonehenge.

PHSE/RSE:

This half term, we will learn about different types of relationships, how to build healthy friendships and the importance of respect, empathy and communication.

RE:

We will learn about the Christian belief in the Trinity – that God is one but known as the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. We will explore how Christians use symbols, stories and worship to understand and describe the nature of God.

DT:

In DT, we will design and make a utility belt by turning 2D fabric into a 3D product, using sewing techniques and choosing materials for their function, while evaluating and improving our designs based on feedback.

ICT:

In ICT, we will be learning all about how to stay safe online.

Music:

We will be creating musical compositions inspired by an animation, exploring how to use sound, tempo, and dynamics to reflect mood and movement.

Geography:

This half term, Y3 will be learning about North America by exploring the question 'Beyond the Magic Kingdom -What is the Sunshine State really like?' Pupils will gain an understanding of the physical and human geographical features of a region in North America with which they can begin to compare and contrast the characteristics of a region of the United Kingdom.

French:

We will learn French words for colours, sizes, and shapes. We will practise describing objects using these adjectives and build sentences to talk about what things look like.

This new half term promises to be an exciting and rewarding journey for all students in Class 3, as we move through the colours and changes of autumn towards the joy and excitement of Christmas. We look forward to a half term full of learning, progress, and enjoyment, where everyone is encouraged to love learning, take on new challenges, show resilience, aim high and treat others with kindness and respect. **You can find more detailed information about the knowledge and skills your child will be learning in our curriculum documents, which can be found on the school website:** <https://thurgolandprimary.org/curriculum-statement/>
