As educators we are all passionate about the way children are formed by the environment in which they grow. To become our best self we will need the environment that enables this.

What are we learning about this half term?

This half term, Class 4 will embark on an exciting journey of discovery across various subjects. Our goal is to provide a well-rounded educational experience that fosters children to love to learn, give things a go, be resilient, show respect and aim high. Below is an overview of the topics we will explore.

Reading:

In Reading, we will read the following books: Krindlekrax. This is an exciting book about a monster and a hero who outwits it!

Our focus will be on developing understanding of the high-level vocabulary used across the texts and being able to accurately select key words/phrases for retrieval and vocabulary comprehension questions.

Writing:

In writing we will be using our class text – Krindlekrax - to inspire a non-chronological report and a narrative piece. We will explore the features and style of writing for our non-fiction report, before creating our own monster to publish our own non-chronological report. For our second unit in writing, our narrative will be a descriptive piece using Krindlekrax, as the inspiration for our character description.

Our focus will be on developing the use of sentence structures and using subordinating conjunctions to extend our sentences, to add more depth and information into our writing. In our narrative we will be looking at figurative language to describe our new monster.

Mathematics:

Our mathematics curriculum will cover foundational concepts, including: Multiplication, Division and learning how to calculate area. We will begin to learn multiplication in column method and division using short division.

Science:

In science, we will focus on: states of matter. This unit will provide plenty of hands-on experiments to understand and observe materials changing state between solids, liquids and gases. You could learn this at home too with the melting chocolate experiment to make a solid into a liquid and then add some rice krispies to make rice krispie buns and watch the chocolate solidify again!

Physical Education:

We will begin building our knowledge and expertise in dodgeball, learning to dodge the ball and aim with our throwing to get the opposition out. We will also explore movement in gymnastics and create routines. We have an upcoming sports competition for dodgeball too this half term for boys and girls!

PHSE/RSE:

We will be learning all about how our bodies grow and change as we continue to grow.

Geography:

In DT this half term, we will become authors, illustrators and publishers of our very own moving book. We will explore levers, pull-outs and spinning components to a moving book, before writing, designing and creating our own.

Music:

We will explore the rock n roll era in music and creating our own pieces!

Geography:

We will explore the question of, 'Why do so many people live in mega-cities?' and develop understanding of the geographical features of mega cities and the advantages of living in one.

French:

In French we will learn all about clothes and dressing ourselves and how to communicate this in French.

RE:

In RE, we learn all about the Christianity exploring the key question of, 'What kind of world did Jesus want?' We take time to reflect on this and how we act within the world we live in today.

This half term promises to be an enriching and enjoyable experience for all students in Class 4. We look forward to a season filled with learning, growth, and fun!
