What are we learning about this half term?

This half term, Class 5 will embark on an exciting journey of discovery across various subjects. Our goal is to provide a well-rounded educational experience that fosters children to love to learn, give things a go, be resilient, show respect and aim high. Below is an overview of the topics we will explore.

Reading:

In Reading, we will read the following book: Flotsam by D. Wiesner and The Last Bear by Hannah Gold

Our focus will be on understanding climate change through these texts and developing our understanding of new vocabulary and different question types for written answers.

Writing:

In writing we will be exploring persuasive arguments against plastic pollution, writing biographies about David Attenborough, learning how to use rhythm and rhyme in narrative poetry as well as completing some Christmas themed pieces closer to the end of term.

Our focus will be on developing our use of relative clauses, modal verbs and using subordinating conjunctions effectively.

Mathematics:

Our mathematics curriculum will cover foundational concepts, including:
Multiplication, division and fractions

Science:

In science, we will focus on: Forces

Students will learn about how forces impact our world including balanced and unbalanced forces, resistance forces and gravity. They will compose enquiry questions and make observations through this interactive unit.

Physical Education:

In PE children will be learning tag rugby skills and participating in gymnastics.

PHSE/RSE:

This half term, children will be looking at the topic of Growing and Changing and at the different changes boys and girls go through during puberty.

Art / DT:

In DT, children will be baking bread and choosing their own delicious ingredients to enhance the recipe thinking about the purpose of their bakes. In Art, children will be learning about Frieda Kahlo and studying some of her amazing work creating self-portraits in her style.



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Music:

Children will be learning about the history of the blues and performing a 12-bar piece of music.

Geography / History:

This half term, Y5 will be learning about climate change. Children will 'travel' around the world from Gambia to Australia; the UK to Greenland, all the while learning about how climate change affects different parts of the world and what communities can do to fight against these changes.

French:

Children will be learning to describe the solar system and compare planets in French this half term.

This half term promises to be an enriching and enjoyable experience for all students in Class 5. We look forward to a season filled with learning, growth, and fun!
