As educators we are all passionate about the way children are formed by the environment in which they grow. To become our best self we will need the environment that enables this.

What are we learning about this half term?

This half term, Class 2 will embark on an exciting journey of discovery across various subjects. Our goal is to provide a well-rounded educational experience that fosters children to love to learn, give things a go, be resilient, show respect and aim high. Below is an overview of the topics we will explore.

Reading:

Beginning this half-term, we will begin teaching reading through Read Write Inc comprehension. This will give children the opportunity to read a short story or non-fiction text each week. They will be immersed in the new vocabulary within these texts, develop their inference skills with a focus on written comprehension answers and also understand how to read a text fluently and expressively through echo and choral reading.

Writing:

In writing we will be exploring narrative writing with a focus on The Snow Dragon and writing a newspaper report based on the story 'Meet Me By The Steelman'. Our final unit will be writing a recount based on the Class trip to Yorkshire Sculpture Park.

Our focus will be on developing the use of adjectives for descriptive writing, use of sentence openers, contracted forms of words and sequencing adverbials.

Mathematics:

Our mathematics curriculum will continue our work on shapes and their properties. We will then move on to multiplication and division. Times tables will still be our 2, 5 and 10 times tables with the introduction of the 3 times tables.

Science:

In science, our new unit is Healthy Animals. This unit will look at what humans and animals need in order to be alive and to keep healthy.

RE:

This half terms focus is Islam and Ramadan. Our question will be 'What do Muslims celebrate at Eid-ul-Fitr?'.

Physical Education:

Target games and gymnastics.

PHSE/RSE:

Our unit is about 'Being responsible' which includes learning the importance of not giving up, setting goals and trying to achieve them.

History:

Our learning is about Sheffield and Steel – we will be investigating the life of Samuel Fox and his influence over Fox Valley during the development of the steel industry and how this impacted our local area.

Music:

Contrasting dynamics: Space theme. This unit explores space themed soundscapes.

Computing:

This half term we will be learning about how to take photographs. We will look at editing and reviewing photographs.



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This half term promises to be an enriching and enjoyable experience for all students in Class 2. We look forward to a season filled with learning, growth, and fun!
