As educators we are all passionate about the way children are formed by the environment in which they grow. To become our best self we will need the environment that enables this.



What are we learning about this half term?

This half term, Class 3 will be diving into a wide range of exciting learning across our subjects. Our aim is to provide a rich and balanced curriculum that encourages children to love learning, have a go, be resilient, show respect and aim high. Below is an overview of the topics we will be exploring.

Reading

We will read Egyptian Sleepover as a class, exploring the story, characters and vocabulary. We will discuss the plot, make predictions and answer a variety of questions to deepen our understanding and develop our thinking skills.

Writing

We will begin the half term by writing a first-person recount inspired by The Egyptian Cinderella, focusing on sequencing events clearly and using descriptive language to show viewpoint. We will then move on to writing a narrative inspired by Howard Carter, using detail, direct speech and rich vocabulary to bring historical events to life.

Mathematics

In mathematics, we will continue developing our understanding of multiplication and division, using different methods and representations to solve problems. Later in the half term, we will move on to our next topic: length and perimeter. We will measure, compare and calculate lengths, applying our learning to practical contexts.

Science

In science, our focus will be on Forces. We will explore how objects move on different surfaces, investigate the effects of pushes and pulls, and learn about magnets and magnetic materials. We will carry out practical investigations, make predictions, and discuss what our results tell us.

History

This half term, we will learn about the Ancient Egyptians. We will explore who they were, how they lived, their beliefs and the amazing achievements of this fascinating civilisation. We will examine artefacts and evidence to help us understand life in the past.

Art

In art, we will study the bold and colourful pottery designs of Clarice Cliff. We will explore her use of shape, pattern and colour before creating our own artwork inspired by her distinctive style.

RE



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Our RE question this half term is: How do the Five Pillars help Muslims express their faith? We will learn about each of the Five Pillars, understand their importance within Islam, and explore how they guide and support Muslims in their everyday lives.

Physical Education

In PE, we will be developing our gymnastic skills each week. We will practise control, point balance and movement.

PSHE

This half term in PSHE, we will focus on being responsible and understanding our feelings, including learning about grief. We will think about how our actions affect others and explore ways to recognise, express and manage emotions safely and respectfully.

Music

In music, we will be developing our singing skills through Viking-themed songs. We will explore rhythm, pitch and performance, working together to sing with control and confidence.

Computing

In computing, we will learn how to create sequences using a block-based programming language to make music. Children will experiment with combining sounds, building patterns and composing simple pieces, developing their understanding of how technology can be used to create and organise musical ideas.

French

In French, we will be learning numbers. We will practise saying, recognising and using numbers in simple sentences, building our confidence with counting and number vocabulary.

This half term promises to bring plenty of excitement, discovery and progress for Class 3. As we begin the new year, we look forward to seeing children grow in confidence, deepen their learning and approach each day with enthusiasm, resilience, high aspirations and kindness towards others. **You can find more detailed information about the knowledge and skills your child will be learning in our curriculum documents, which can be found on the school website:**
