What are we learning about this half term?

This half term, Class 5 will embark on an exciting journey of discovery across various subjects. Our goal is to provide a well-rounded educational experience that fosters children to love to learn, give things a go, be resilient, show respect and aim high. Below is an overview of the topics we will explore.

Reading

In Reading, we will read the following book: *The Boy in the Girl's Bathroom* by L. Sachar and a video inspiration titled: *The Alchemist's Letter*

Writing

In writing we will be exploring diary entries, writing short narratives and learning what monologues are and how to present them.

Our focus will be on developing our use characterisation, emotive language (show don't tell phrases) and also how to use punctuation effectively.

Mathematics

Our mathematics curriculum will cover foundational concepts, including: Multiplication, division, fractions and decimals and percentages.

Science

In science, we will focus on: Properties of Materials

Students will learn about how materials are used, their purpose, advantages and disadvantages and properties.

Physical Education

In PE children will be learning skills to improve their dodgeball skills and also participating in some Tudor dancing.

PHSE/RSE

This half term, children will be looking at the topic of being responsible and the feeling of anger.

Art / DT

In DT, children will be learning different methods of stitching and creating Tudor Roses.

Music

Children will be learning about South and West African Music where they will learn to sing a traditional African song unaccompanied and create an eight-beat break to play within a performance.

Geography / History

This half term, Y5 will be learning about the Tudors. They will look at how they came to power and how they stayed on the throne.

French

Children will be learning to describe shops and words related to shopping in French this half term.

This half term promises to be an enriching and enjoyable experience for all students in Class 5. We look forward to a season filled with learning, growth, and fun!
