As educators we are all passionate about the way children are formed by the environment in which they grow. To become our best self, we will need the environment that enables this.



What are we learning about this half term?

This half term, Class 6 will embark on an exciting journey of discovery across various subjects. Our goal is to provide a well-rounded educational experience that fosters children to love to learn, give things a go, be resilient, show respect and aim high. Below is an overview of the topics we will explore.

Reading: In Reading, we will read the following book: *The Boy at the Back of the Class* by Onjali Q. Raúf. Our focus will be on developing the understanding of vocabulary and a range of comprehension questions.

Writing: In writing we will be exploring a diary and a non-chronological report. Our focus will be on developing a range of sentences and sentence structure, the use of high-level/figurative vocabulary and the use of parenthesis.

Mathematics: Our mathematics curriculum will consist of Summer projects involving a range of mathematical skills.

Science: Animals including humans- The science of sport.

Religious Education: Sikhism - Why do some Sikhs choose to become part of the Khalsa?

Physical Education: Athletics and Cricket.

PHSE: A world without judgement - British values.

Art: Animals – Franz Marc

Music: Theme and variations – pop music.

History: Vikings – Settlers or raiders?

French: Visiting a town in France.

Dear Parent/Carer,

Important Water Safety Notice

With several schools in our area located near bodies of water, we're reaching out to partner with you in protecting children's safety. Whether during winter when ice forms or in warmer months when swimming seems inviting, bodies of open water can pose serious risks to young people.

We kindly ask all parents/carers to have a crucial conversation with their children about water safety. Please discuss the following safety information with your family to help prevent accidents and ensure everyone stays safe around water throughout the year.

- Attempting to walk on frozen lakes, canals and reservoirs is dangerous and can be fatal.
- Whilst it may be tempting to walk on frozen water, the ice could be unstable and can easily break.
- The temperature of the water is so cold that it can take your breath away which can lead to panic and result in drowning.
- Even during the summer months, water is still cold beneath the surface so entering the water can result in cold water shock.
- The RNLI's "Float to Live" advice is to **resist the instinct to swim hard to safety if you find yourself unexpectedly in the water. Instead, lean back, extend your arms and legs, and float.** Tilt your head back with ears submerged, relax, and control your breathing. Use your hands to help you stay afloat and call for help or swim to safety if possible.
